INDICTMENT

The Grand Jurors of and for the State of New Jersey, upon their oaths, present that:

COUNT ONE

(Theft by Deception-Third Degree)

YVETTE WRIGHT

between on or about October 14, 1998, and on or about February 13, 1999 at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did obtain by deception the property of the State of New Jersey, valued in excess of \$500; that is, the said YVETTE WRIGHT did purposely obtain unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$1990.00 by submitting or causing to be submitted documents for unemployment insurance benefits of the State of New Jersey, thereby creating or reinforcing false impressions to the State of New Jersey that the said YVETTE WRIGHT was unemployed;

WHEREAS IN TRUTH AND IN FACT, as the said YVETTE WRIGHT then and there well knew, she was employed, all contrary to the

provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-4, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TWO

(Theft by Deception-Third Degree)

YVETTE WRIGHT

between on or about October 18, 1999, and on or about January 15, 2000, at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did obtain by deception the property of the State of New Jersey, valued in excess of \$500; that is, the said YVETTE WRIGHT did purposely obtain unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$2800.00 by submitting or causing to be submitted documents for unemployment insurance benefits of the State of New Jersey, thereby creating or reinforcing false impressions to the State of New Jersey that the said YVETTE WRIGHT was unemployed;

WHEREAS IN TRUTH AND IN FACT, as the said YVETTE WRIGHT then and there well knew, he was employed, all contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-4, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT THREE

(Theft by Deception-Third Degree)

YVETTE WRIGHT

between on or about January 19, 2001, and on or about February 3, 2001, at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did obtain by deception the property of the State of New Jersey, valued in excess of \$500; that is, the said YVETTE WRIGHT did purposely obtain unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$642.00 by submitting or causing to be submitted documents for unemployment insurance benefits of the State of New Jersey, thereby creating or reinforcing false impressions to the State of New Jersey that the said YVETTE WRIGHT was unemployed;


WHEREAS IN TRUTH AND IN FACT, as the said YVETTE WRIGHT then and there well knew, he was employed, all contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-4, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT FOUR

(Unsworn Falsification to Authorities-Fourth Degree)


YVETTE WRIGHT

on or about February 9, 2001, at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did make a written false statement which she did not believe to be true on or pursuant to a form bearing notice, authorized by law, to the effect that false statements made therein are punishable; that is, the said YVETTE WRIGHT did make and submit or cause to be submitted Unemployment Insurance Benefit check number 23664318 dated February 6, 2001, containing a false statement that the said YVETTE WRIGHT did report all holiday or vacation pay and otherwise met all eligibility requirements to receive unemployment insurance benefits for the week ending January 27, 2001, and February 3, 2001, and said form bearing notice, authorized by law, to the effect that false statements made therein are punishable, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:28-3a, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.
