CRIMINAL ACTION

ACCUSATION

ANTHONY IMPREVEDUTO, having been charged with one count of Misapplication of Entrusted Property and Property of Government or Financial Institution (third degree), in violation of N.J.S.A. 2C:21-15, and one count of Concealment or Misrepresentation of Contributions or Expenditures (fourth degree), in violation of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-21(b), and having in writing waived indictment and trial by jury and having requested to be tried upon Accusation before this Court, and said request having been granted;

Attorney General Peter C. Harvey, for the State of New Jersey, by and through Deputy Attorney General Anthony A. Picione, of the New Jersey Division of Criminal Justice, alleges that:

COUNT ONE

(Misapplication of Entrusted Property and Property of Government or Financial Institution - Third Degree)

ANTHONY IMPREVEDUTO

between in or about August 1999 and May 2004, at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, at the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did apply or dispose of property, that is funds, that had been entrusted to him as a fiduciary, in a manner which the said ANTHONY IMPREVEDUTO knew was unlawful and involved substantial risk of loss or detriment to the owner of the property, thereby deriving a benefit of over \$1,000, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:21-15, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of same.

COUNT TWO

(Concealment or Misrepresentation of Contributions or Expenditures - Fourth Degree)

ANTHONY IMPREVEDUTO

between in or about August 1999 and May 2004, at the City of Trenton, in the County of Mercer, at the Town of Secaucus, in the County of Hudson, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, did purposely file or prepare, assist in the preparation for filing or acquiesce in the preparation or filing of reports required under the New Jersey Campaign Contributions and Expenditures Reporting Act which the said ANTHONY IMPREVEDUTO knew were false, inaccurate or incomplete in any material particular to wit, in the reporting of certain expenditures, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 19:44A-21(b), and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of same.
