The Grand Jurors of and for the State of New Jersey, upon their oaths, present that:

COUNT ONE

(Theft by Deception-Third Degree)

FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS

between on or about May 8, 1999 through November 3, 1999, at the Town of Irvington, in the County of Essex, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did obtain by deception the property of the State of New Jersey, valued in excess of \$500; that is, the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS did purposely obtain unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$5,698 by submitting or causing to be submitted documents for unemployment insurance benefits to the State of New Jersey, thereby creating or reinforcing false impressions to the State of New Jersey that the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS was unemployed;

WHEREAS IN TRUTH AND IN FACT, as the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS then and there well knew, he was employed, all contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-4, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT TWO

(Theft by Deception-Third Degree)

FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS

between on or about April 21, 2001 through July 25, 2001, at the Town of Irvington, in the County of Essex, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, purposely did obtain by deception the property of the State of New Jersey, valued in excess of \$500; that is, the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS did purposely obtain unemployment insurance benefits in the amount of \$2,758 by submitting or causing to be submitted documents for unemployment insurance benefits to the State of New Jersey, thereby creating or reinforcing false impressions to the State of New Jersey that the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS was unemployed;


WHEREAS IN TRUTH AND IN FACT, as the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS then and there well knew, he was employed, all contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:20-4, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.

COUNT THREE


(Unsworn Falsification to Authorities-Fourth Degree)

FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS

on or about July 25, 2001 at the at the Town of Irvington, in the County of Essex, elsewhere, and within the jurisdiction of this Court, knowingly did make a written false statement which he did not believe to be true on or pursuant to a form bearing notice, authorized by law, to the effect that false statements made therein are punishable; that is, the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS did make and submit or cause to be submitted Unemployment Insurance Benefit check number 25056160 dated July 23, 2001, containing a false statement that the said FLOYDZEL WILLIAMS did report all holiday or vacation pay and otherwise met all eligibility requirements to receive unemployment insurance benefits for the compensable weeks ending July 14 and July 21, 2001, respectively, and said form bearing notice, authorized by law, to the effect that false statements made therein are punishable, contrary to the provisions of N.J.S.A. 2C:28-3a, and against the peace of this State, the government and dignity of the same.
